1. Union College: Visiting Assistant Professor

The Department of Electrical, Computer and Biomedical Engineering at Union College invites applications for a 3-year Visiting Assistant Professor of Biomedical Engineering position, beginning Fall 2024. A Ph.D. in Biomedical Engineering or a closely related field is required. Candidates expecting to complete their doctoral thesis before September 2024 are also welcome to apply. Excellent candidates in all areas of Biomedical Engineering will be considered, but preference will be given to candidates with expertise in biomechanics, rehabilitation engineering, or biomaterials.

Please follow the application submission instructions. Applications should include a CV, a teaching statement, and a research statement. The research statement should address how the candidate will include undergraduate students in their scholarly activities. You will be asked to include names and contact information for three references and an email will be sent to references requesting a letter of recommendation after an initial screening. 2. The Ohio State University: Tenure-Track Associate Professor in Engineering Education

The Ohio State University's Department of Engineering Education is seeking to fill two tenure-track, associate professor positions to start August 2024. This unique opportunity aims to grow EED's tenure-track/tenured faculty through the addition of established scholars and leaders who bring unique prior academic experiences gained through non-tenure-track roles.
