1. **Biomedical Engineering Education Call for Papers – Preparing Students for Professional Practice Special Issue**
Biomedical Engineering Education announces a special call for papers focused on professional development in biomedical engineering education. We aim to solicit papers from a wide range of courses and programs, at the undergraduate, master's and/or PhD level, focused on preparing students for the workforce or connecting academic pursuits with professional practice. Topical areas can include - but are not limited to - activities, programs, or research in the following areas:
 - Skills-building (e.g., prototyping, regulatory, clinical, quality)
 - Competency-building (e.g., ethics, teamwork, communication, interdisciplinary collaboration)
 - Experiential learning (e.g., course-based efforts, internships, co-ops, clubs, project extensions)
 - Industry partnerships (e.g., sponsored/mentored design or capstone courses, field trips, shadowing)
 - Alternative career pathways in BME (e.g., business, medicine, patent law).

Papers should articulate how their context contributes to preparing BME students for professional practice and include contextual framing of professional development practices in the literature.

Papers may be one of the following types (additional detail can be found [here](#)):

- Teaching Tips articles – short papers that illustrate how to implement evidence-based practices in the BME classroom, curriculum, or extracurricular programs.
- Innovation articles – full-length articles that describe the application of evidence-based science and engineering education best practices in a BME setting.
- Research articles – full-length articles that describe original, hypothesis-driven, or research question-driven work in BME education.
- Perspective articles – guest editorials sharing evidenced-based insights about current trends, challenges, diversity, or other pressing topics in BME education.
- Review articles – articles that critically summarize important aspects of BME education, adding insights that advance BME education research and practice.

Authors are encouraged to [submit an abstract](#) that defines the paper type and the general scope of the intended paper to gain editor feedback. Authors may submit a full paper without first having submitted an abstract.

- Submission of abstracts (~300 words in length, optional) July 15, 2025
- Notification of editorial feedback on abstracts August 15, 2025
- Submission of manuscript January 5, 2026

2. Call for ASEE BED Officer Nominations: The ASEE Biomedical Engineering Division holds its elections at the Business Meeting at the Annual Conference. Save the date for the Business Meeting: **Tuesday, June 24 from 11am-12:30pm local time (Montreal)**. Our bylaws require us to have at least two members running in an election for every open position. We encourage you to consider running for the following open positions:

- **Program Chair-Elect:** Assists the Program Chair and manages the work-in-progress portion of the BED program at the Annual Conference. It is expected that this individual will subsequently serve as Program Chair, Division Chair, and Immediate Past Chair in the subsequent 3 years. (1-year term with subsequent commitments totaling 4 years)
- **Treasurer:** Oversees and maintains the financial records of the Division and ensures that activities conform to ASEE financial policies and standards. (2-year term)
- **Secretary/Webmaster:** Records minutes at the BED business meeting and other meetings throughout the year, maintains official records, produces division publications, and maintains BED website. (1-year term)
- **Division Vice Chair for Honors and Awards:** Leads the Awards Selection Committee in selecting Division awards. (2-year term)
- **Vice Chair for Events:** Organizes and plans the BED social and awards banquet at the Annual Conference, and any other events that arise. (1-year term)
- **Member-at-Large:** Serves as judge (and recruits other judges) for the WIPs at the Annual Conference, serves as judge for the BED Travel Award(s), and serves in other capacities on an ad-hoc basis. (3-year term)
