ASEE ELD Criteria and Procedures for the Annual Conference Proceedings

1. Criteria

- a. Topics shall be appropriate to the mission of ASEE, the theme of the conference, and the interests of the Division.
- b. The papers shall be substantive in nature, consisting of a conceptual, experimental or applied treatment of a topic.
- c. Papers shall be a complete intellectual piece so that readers can learn from or apply the ideas contained therein.
- d. Papers shall have proper references, where appropriate.
- e. Papers shall be clearly, concisely and accurately written.
- f. Illustrations will be legible, properly labelled, and reproducible.

2. Network of reviewers

The ELD Publications Committee is responsible for the review of papers. The Publications Committee consists of a Chair, several members, and the Chairs of the Subcommittees on Literature Guides, the Union List of Technical Reports, Standards and Patents in Engineering Libraries, and the Membership Directory. All members of the Publications Committee and its Subcommittees are available as reviewers. The Chair will assign each paper to two reviewers from different institutions.

THE DIFFUSION OF FEDERALLY FUNDED SCIENTIFIC AND TECHNICAL INFORMATION (STI) IN AEROSPACE

There is a major research project underway of interest to engineering librarians. The NASA/DOD funded project is concerned with understanding the diffusion of federally funded STI in aerospace. The project has the following two major objectives:

- understanding the systems, channels, and information products involved in the production, transfer, and use of federally funded STI in aerospace and
- understanding the information-seeking habits and practices of U.S. aerospace engineers, scientists, and engineering students

The desired outcomes of the project include a better understanding of the diffusion of federally funded STI in aerospace, improving and maintaining the professional competency of U.S. aerospace engineers and scientists, increased productivity, and better aerospace STI systems

As presently contituted, the project has the following four phases:

- Phase 1 The study of U.S. aerospace engineers and scientists as users of federally funded STI
- Phase 2 The study of aerospace librarians and technical information specialists as information intermediaries in the transfer of federally funded STI
- Phase 3 The study of aerospace engineering and science students in the U.S. as users of federally funded STI
- Phase 4 The study of aerospace engineers and scientists in England, France, Germany, and Japan as users of federally funded STI

Phase 3 is scheduled to run from February through June 1990 and involves a survey of students, faculty, and engineering librarians. Some of the objectives of Phase 3

are.

- To explore the information-seeking habits and practices of aerospace students and faculty
- To determine the familiarity and use by aerospace students and faculty of NASA/DOD STI products and services
- To explore the relationship between academic information intermediaries and aerospace students and faculty

Librarians responsible for aerospace collections at institutions with degree programs in aerospace engineering will be asked to participate in this phase. Anyone interested in becoming involved with Phase 3 or wishing to learn more about the entire project should contact.

WPI LIBRARY CATALOG ON CAMPUS NETWORK

At Worcester Polytechnic Institute the George C. Gordon Library and the College Computer Center offer a program that allows the campus community to access the library's online catalog, as well as other library services and information, from remote locations via the campus network. All that users need is an account on WPI's central mainframe computer and a terminal or PC that can access the network. Besides online catalog access, the program also offers a bulletin board containing information about library hours and services; a book order request function for faculty; and a reserve book request facility, also for faculty.
