CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

The ELD Nominating Committee would like to invite interested members to run for the offices of Secretary/Treasurer and Director. If you would like to nominate yourself or a colleague for either of these positions please contact Lisa Ngo at lingo@berkeley.edu.

Self-nominations are encouraged and if you are nominating someone else, please be sure that you have their permission to nominate and that they are willing to run. Any nominee must indicate in writing their willingness to serve before their name is placed in nomination. Per ELD Bylaws: "The Nominating Committee shall submit a slate of candidates to the membership no later than the third Friday of February... On or before the second Friday of March, ballots shall be made available to the membership electronically." The 2025 dates are February 21 and March 14, respectively.

ELD thrives on the strength and participation of its membership. We highly encourage individuals from all underrepresented communities to apply for leadership positions within ELD. New officers have a broad support network of current and former officers to draw from for advice and expertise. Below are more details about each office:

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS (CONTINUED)

Secretary/Treasurer

Election to Secretary/Treasurer starts a four-year commitment to the ELD officer track.

- 2025-2026: The ELD member elected in 2025 will assume office at the end of the Annual Business Meeting at the 2025 conference in Montreal, Canada.
- 2026-2027: The Secretary/Treasurer becomes the Program Chair at the end of the 2026 conference in Charlotte, NC, responsible for planning the 2027 conference in Toronto, Canada.
- 2027-2028: At the end of the 2027 conference, the Program Chair becomes Division Chair and will serve through the 2028 conference in Pittsburgh, PA.
- 2028-2029: At the end of the 2028 conference, the Chair becomes Past Chair/Chair of the Nominating Committee serving until the 2029 conference in Salt Lake City, UT.

The Secretary/Treasurer, Program Chair, and Chair sit on both the Executive Committee (EC) and the Extended Executive Committee (EEC). The Past Chair/Chair of the Nominating Committee is a member of the EEC only. Progression from one office to the next takes place at the end of each year's Business Meeting.

Director

The Directorship is a two-year commitment. During their first year the Director organizes the ELD welcome reception at the Annual Conference. In year two the Director organizes the annual banquet. The person elected Director in 2025 will organize the welcome reception in 2026 in Charlotte, NC, and the annual banquet in 2027 in Toronto, Canada. The Director is a member of the EC and the EEC during their entire two-year term.

Complete descriptions of the roles and duties of ELD officers are available in Article IV of the <u>Bylaws</u> and on the website. Many ELD members who have served in these positions would be happy to discuss their experiences with potential candidates. Please see <u>the list of past chairs and past directors for names</u>. Members of the Nominating Committee are also available should you have any questions.

ANNUAL CONFERENCE UPDATE



Bonjour, ELD members,

Planning for the Annual ASEE Conference, June 22-25, 2025, in Montréal, Québec, Canada, is in progress. Based on the number of abstracts and special session proposals submitted, it looks like many of us are very excited about attending the conference!

Conference <u>registration is open</u> and the least expensive option, the promotion rate (\$795 USD for members), ends on 12/31/2024.

If you're traveling by air, passports are required. By car, passports may be required. Some states (e.g., Michigan) offer enhanced driver's IDs, but most do not. Ensure that your passport will be valid for the entire duration of your stay, and it's recommended to have an extra six months left on your passport's validity.

The conference schedule is similar to how it has been for the last couple of years, with no Sunday business meetings or technical sessions, and workshops being held on Sunday from 1:00p-3:30p to allow attendees to travel on Sunday morning if they prefer. Poster presenters will again be able to have their posters on display throughout the entire conference, beginning on Sunday. ANNOUNCING THE ELD DIVERSITY TRAVEL GRANT

The Engineering Libraries Division is excited to announce the establishment of a Diversity Travel Grant for the 2025 ASEE Annual Conference. The grant will support travel for a library worker or a library student from one or more underrepresented groups with interest in or commitment to engineering librarianship.

The awardee will receive \$1,500 for travel costs, complimentary registration to the ASEE 2025 Annual Conference at the Member rate, and an opportunity to actively contribute to the ELD conference program.

The 2025 ELD Diversity Travel Grant is generously funded by the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS) and ASEE. More information, including eligibility criteria and application instructions, will be released when applications open in January 2025. Be on the lookout!


