

Q: Talk about your professional background (education, research, and academic positions)

JA: My background is a bit of a meandering path, but it led me to a great place! Both of my degrees are in Chemical Engineering, but with an emphasis on applying engineering principles to cell and developmental biology and modeling. I joined the Bioengineering Department at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign in 2009 to teach design as well as help develop the newly formed undergraduate program. I also had the pleasure of helping to form Carle Illinois College of Medicine, a first of its kind engineering integrated medical curriculum.

BM: I earned my BSEE in Electrical Engineering from Ohio Northern University, and my Ph.D. in Electrical Engineering from The Pennsylvania State University, University Park. My research focus for my Ph.D. was in Control Systems, but my current research interests include Control Systems, Mechatronic Systems, and Engineering Education. I am currently an Associate Professor of Electrical Engineering and Chair of the Department of Physical Sciences & Engineering at Anderson University in Anderson, IN. Prior to that I was an Assistant Professor of Engineering at Roger Williams University in Bristol, RI.

Q: How did you first get involved with ASEE and, specifically, ASEE IL-IN?

JA: I have been attending ASEE for many years to learn about how to improve my own teaching in biomedical engineering for many years. While ASEE national is a great place to connect with colleagues at different campuses for my discipline, the regional conference provides a venue to form local collaborations. At the regional conference, I am looking to find ideas from colleagues outside of my discipline and also new collaborators for grants and projects.

BM: My initial introduction to ASEE was through colleagues at Roger Williams University (ASEE-Northeast), where I participated in the section conference all four years I was there. I also have published and presented at the ASEE National conference several times. When I moved to Indiana, I wanted to get involved as a volunteer with my professional societies (IEEE and ASEE), and attended the 2019 ASEE IL-IN Section Conference. When the opportunity arose to serve, I jumped on board.

Q: What have you accomplished so far in your new position on the ASEE IL-IN board and what future plans do you have?

JA: As the Awards Chair, I have the pleasure of reading about our wonderful candidates for teacher of the year and representative of the year as well as other awards. It is fun getting to know about my colleagues. This coming year, I am organizing the regional conference, hosted by the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, and look forward to coordinating the event with networking sessions and social events to further bring our region together.

BM: I am currently the webmaster and Future Conference Chair. So far I have revised and rebuilt significant portions of the section website, and I hope to host an excellent section conference at Anderson University in 2022. Message from the Zone II Chair

I'm John Brocato, your new ASEE Zone II Chair for 2020-2021!

My academic background is in engineering communication, and, in my previous position at Mississippi State University (MSU), I helped establish one of the earliest embedded engineering-communication programs in the country. This program teaches discipline-specific writing and presenting to every engineering undergraduate at strategic points in their careers, including freshman intro courses, senior capstone design, and a required technical-writing course.

In August 2019, I joined the School of Chemical, Materials, and Biomedical Engineering at the University of Georgia (UGA) as a Technical Communication Lecturer. Although UGA has long offered engineering degrees, the UGA Col-

lege of Engineering is only about eight years old, so I saw this move as an opportunity to get in on the ground floor, so to speak. Thus far, I've developed two communication-intensive courses for undergraduate and graduate students alike. I'm most proud of the undergraduate course; called The Bioengineering Professional Persona, this course seeks to help students understand the sociocultural context of their chosen profession with an emphasis on effective communication and analyses of ethics case studies, including Henrietta Lacks, the bioengineering perspective on pandemics, and the space shuttle *Challenger* disaster.

I joined ASEE in 2004 and served as MSU's Campus Representative for 15 years. I've served in many leadership roles for the Southeastern Section (including the current Proceedings Editor) and, at the national level, the Liberal Education/Engineering and Society Division (LEES). I became an ASEE Fellow in 2018 and was lucky enough to be elected Zone II Chair the next year. In this role, I represent the Southeastern, Illinois-Indiana, and North-Central Sections and serve as your direct liaison with the ASEE Board of Directors. I view this role primarily as one of listening to what the Zone II sections want, need, and expect from ASEE national and then doing all I can to help them meet these needs.



I look forward to meeting and working with you over the next two years and attending your section meetings (virtual

or otherwise) as well as your Executive Board meetings as needed. Please don't hesitate to reach out to me – I am at your service!
