Minutes of the

Seventeenth Annual Meeting of the Southeastern Section of the American Society for Engineering Education

March 22, 23, 24, 1951

The seventeenth annual meeting of the Southeastern Section of the American Society for Engineering Education was held at Biloxi, Mississippi with the Mississippi State College as host, on March 22, 23, and 24.

A total of 176 engineering educators and their wives registered for the meeting. A copy of the registration list is attached.

The first day, Thursday, was devoted to the research branch meeting and the proceedings are not recorded in these minutes.

Friday morning the meeting was called to order at 9:30 A.M. with Dean E. B. Norris of V.P.I. presiding. The meeting was held in the Hurricane Room of the Buena Vista Hotel.

Dean Norris appointed three committees as follows:

Resolutions: Dean W. H. Hall of Duke University, chairman, Dr. W. G. Van Note, of V.P.I., and

Dr. F. H. Pumphrey, of the University of Florida.

Nominations: Dean N. W. Dougherty of the University of Tenn., chairman Dean J. E. Hannum, of Alabama Polytechnic Institute, and Prof. W. A. Murray of V.P.I.

Place of Meeting: Dean L. L. Patterson of Mississippi State College,
Dean L. J. Lassalle, of Louisiana State University, and
Dean F. J. Lewis, of Vanderbilt University.

Dean Norris introduced Dr. L. E. Grinter, Chairman and Research Professor of Civil Engineering and Mechanics, Illinois Institute of Technology, who gave a report for the committee on the improvement of teaching. This was in the form of a progress report, and the final report should be available in 1952.

Dr. Grinter's report listed several suggestions on the question "How to improve teaching?" and concluded that this should be attacked from the grass roots, placing manuals in the hands of every teacher, the use of rating sheets, the do's and dont's of good teaching, class visitations, the use of discussion groups, and so forth. He concluded that the whole job boiled down to one of promotion.

Dr. R. L. Sweigert, Dean of the Graduate School at Georgia School of Technology, in discussing this same subject gave his ideas on "What constitutes a good teacher?" and listed four items which may be used as a guide to answer this question: 1. Inspiration

2. Ability to explain

3. Knowledge of the field

4. Organization.

Prof. Fred H. Pumphrey, of the University of Florida, listed five items which he felt were necessary to good teaching. They are:

1. Adequate background 2. Interest in the students

3. Adequate preparation 4. Personality

5. Ability to interest students in their work.

Dean N. W. Dougherty, of the University of Tennessee, suggested that we see what we are trying to do and fit what we are doing into that end. A copy of Dean Dougherty's paper is attached.

In the discussion period comments were made by Arthur Hill of Tulane, who suggested that the teacher try to slant his course toward the field in which the students are interested. Also student confidence may be obtained by treating grades more as compensation for work done.

Professor W. J. Seeley of Duke, suggested that research inspired teachers to do better jobs and that industrial experience also is a big help to a teacher.

Dean Lassalle of Tulane, commented on the fact that an instructor should not be too quick to criticize a student for asking a question, for so often he does not know how to word what he is trying to ask.

After a five-minute recess the chairman introduced Prof. John P. Nielson, Associate Professor of Metal Science of New York University, who read his paper on "Fundamentalization vs Specialization." A copy of his paper is attached.

Dr. F. C. Vonderlage, director of the Oak Ridge School of Reactor Technology gave a report on the school, its purpose and operation. A copy of the paper is attached.

After a brief discussion, the morning session was adjourned.

The luncheon meeting was held in the Rose Room of the Buena Vista Hotel at 1:00 P.M. with Dean R. L. Sumwalt, of the University of South Carolina, presiding.

An address of welcome was made by Dean Emeritus, L. L. Patterson, of the Mississippi State College.

Dean Earnst, of the University of Louisville, gave a report for the Committee for Cooperation with the A.E.C. and asked Dr. Thompson to make a few comments. Dr. Thompson outlined some of the text material that has been and will be available to the schools.

Dr. William Dryden, Adm. Assistant University Relations Division of the Oak Ridge institute for Nuclear Studies, gave an outline of the

"Nuclear Summer School" which will be held August 27 to September 6 at Oak Ridge.

Dr. Henry H. Armsby was unable to be present at the meeting, but Dean E. B. Norris read two letters from him expressing his regrets and stating the possibility of the E.S.M.W.T. being reactivated.

There being no further business, the luncheon meeting was adjourned until 7:00 P.M., leaving the afternoon open for recreation.

The evening session was held in the Hurricane Room of the Buena Vista Hotel with Dean E. B. Norris presiding.

Dean Norris introduced Dr. Joseph C. Morris, vice president and Head of the Department of Physics at Tulane University, who delivered an address on "An Intangible Weapon for Defense." A copy is attached.

The Deans' Breakfast was held in the Fiesta Room of the Buena Vista Hotel at 8:00 A.M. Saturday.

The Saturday morning session was opened at 9:30 A. M. with a report of the Committee on Promotion Policies by Prof. G. F. Matthes of L.S.U., in the absence of the chairman, Dr. J. H. Mason of Georgia School of Technology. A copy of the report is attached.

A report of the Committee on Travel Allowances was given by the chairman, Dean J. E. Hannum of Alabama Polytechnic Institute.

Prof. Willard Hubbell of the University of Miami, made a motion that the committee be continued for further detailed study. The motion was seconded and passed. A copy of the report is attached.

Dean N. W. Dougherty of the University of Tennessee presented a report of the Committee on Graduate Cooperative programs, a copy of which is attached.

A progress report of the Engineering School Library Committee was given by Dean L. H. Johnson of Tulane University, a copy of which is attached.

The Business Session:

Dean Hannum made a motion that the reading of the minutes of the 16th Annual Meeting be waived and that they be approved as presented. The motion was seconded and passed.

The treasurer's report was presented and approved. Copy attached.

A report from the Nominating Committee was given by Dean Dougherty and presented:

For Chairman, Dean R. L. Sumwalt, Univ. of So. Carolina For vice chairman, Dean J. V. Terrell, Univ. of Kentucky. For Sec.-Treas., Prof. B. M. Bayer, Vanderbilt University For Member of the Council, Prof. Fred H. Pumphrey, Univ. of Florida For representative of Section on Advisory Council on Mathematics in Business, Industry, Science, and Engineering, Dr. C. R. Vail, Duke University

A motion was made, seconded, and passed that the report be accepted and that the candidates be elected without opposition.

Dean Patterson, reporting for the Committee on Place of Meeting for 1952, suggested that the location be close to the center of the area and Clemson College was suggested for the site.

A motion was made, seconded, and passed that Clemson be accepted as the location for the 1952 meeting and that the time be left to the host institution.

In the absence of Dean Hall, Prof. W. J. Seeley read the report of the Committee on Resolutions, which follows.
