# MINUTES OF THE TWENTY-FOURTH ANNUAL MEETING OF THE SOUTHEASTERN SECTION OF THE AMERICAN SOCIETY FOR ENGINEERING EDUCATION

APRIL 17 - 18, 1958

The twenty-fourth annual meeting of the Southeastern Section of the American Society for Engineering Education was held on April 17 and 18, 1958, at Miami Beach, Florida, with the University of Miami as the host institution. In addition to 20 members from the host institution, there were 104 educators from 33 institutions, i retired, and 15 from industry, making a total attendance of 140. Included in this total were 10 national officers, the President, 6 Vice Presidents, the Secretary, the Treasurer, and the President Elect.

The annual business meeting convened on April 17, 1958, at 12:52 PM, Lee Johnson presiding.

It was stated that the YET award had been won by Charley Scott of Mississippi State, and the award of the Research Division had been won by William A. Mash, Professor of Engineering Mechanics at the University of Florida.

Les Johnson proposed consideration of an amendment to the constitution to make the Secretary-Treasurer eligible for election to President, to be voted on at a future meeting. It was moved, seconded, and approved
