The 2022 ASEE-SE Conference was hosted by The Citadel School of Engineering in Charleston, SC. The conference theme was "Educating Principled Engineering Leaders of Tomorrow." We had a total of 157 conference participants, including 117 faculty and professionals, and 40 students. Participants presented 78 papers during 17 conference sessions, along with 17 student posters.

The conference was supported by the South Carolina Board of Registration for Engineers and Surveyors, local industry and academic partners. 137 Professional Development Hours were earned during the conference by 31 professional engineers, representing 14 states.

I hope you enjoyed the Welcome Reception at the Old Citadel on Sunday, Plenary Session with Imagineering Educator Thomas Riddle, paper sessions, roundtables, student posters, Monday Banquet with John Peeples as Invited Speaker, and awards presented to 7 faculty and 9 students.
