**What is a Lightning Talk?** A Lightning Talk is a very short presentation on a timely topic of interest to the audience. This year, we are hoping for a variety of talks on any number of subjects, including, but not limited to:

- Digital initiatives
- New partnerships
- Innovative programs and services
- Or anything you think might be of interest to your peers

Member Talks are ~2-3 minutes and Sponsor Lightning Talks are ~1-2 minutes, 1 slide. The main goals of these sessions are to learn about what our colleagues and sponsors are doing, and to generate discussions during the sessions and over the course of the conference.

Your proposal should include:

- Your name, email, title, and organization
- Title of talk
- Type of talk (Member or Sponsor)
- Brief description of your talk (no more than 3 sentences)

Once your proposal has been accepted, you will be notified and given specific instructions as to what comes next.

**All presenters are required to be registered for the ASEE conference, be around to do your presentation and answer questions after the presentation.**
