### **Lightning Talks**

What is a Lightning Talk?

A Lightning Talk is a very short presentation on a timely topic of interest to the audience. This year, we are hoping for a variety of talks on any topic, including but not limited to:

- Digital initiatives
- Innovative projects, programs, or services
- New partnerships
- New technology, tools, or products

Each Member Talk is 3 minutes long, and each Sponsor Talk is 1 minute long. The main goals are to learn about what our peers and sponsors are currently working on and to generate discussions during the session and throughout the conference.

### **AI & Information Literacy Teaching Exchange**

This year, the artificial intelligence (AI) and information literacy teaching exchange is a new session for ELD. It will be held on Monday, June 24, from 3:15 to 4:45 p.m. This session aims to explore how librarians and faculty are incorporating AI into their information literacy instruction, reference services, learning tools, and assessment strategies. Submit a proposal to share your experience, successes, and challenges.

We seek proposals from those who have used AI in their information literacy teaching; some ideas might include:

- Teaching about AI during information literacy sessions?
- Working with faculty and instructors around the use of AI and information literacy.
- Are you using AI during reference, either face-to-face or virtually?
- Designing assignments that involve AI?
- Assessment of learning through AI?
- Created learning tools using AI? Or that incorporate the use of AI?
- Integrated a specific AI resource into your information literacy curriculum?

The AI teaching exchange will consist of 45-60 minutes of short presentations on using AI in information literacy instruction. The specific time limit for the presentations will depend on the number of proposals received and accepted. Following the presentations, there will be breakout sessions for further discussion. This session provides an opportunity to exchange ideas and learn from colleagues.
