## ASEE IL-IN Travels to Puerto Rico for Zone 2 Conference: "Engineering Everywhere for Everyone"

For the first time since 1988, the Illinois-Indiana Section will collaborate with all Zone II Sections for a joint Zone II Conference in the Southeastern Section location of beautiful San Juan, Puerto Rico, March 2-5, 2017. All three sections will jointly host the Zone II conference instead of individual sectional conferences. Zone II consists of the North Central Section, the


Illinois-Indiana Section, and the Southeastern Section. Conference chairs include Section president Tom Trusty and ASEE Zone II National Board of Directors member Gary Steffan.

The conference will include a variety of paper presentations, panels, invited workshops from Puerto Rican facilitators, an undergraduate poster session, and, possibly, a graduate recruitment fair, in addition to several receptions and meals for socializing and networking. This Zone II conference is a wonderful opportunity for academic and industry representatives to discuss and share relevant topics in improving the engineering experience. Participants include college deans, department chairs, student service professionals, advisors, faculty in engineering and engineering technology, K-12 teachers, and industry leaders from throughout the Zone. The conference venue is the Caribe Hilton Hotel in San Juan, Puerto Rico, a beachfront hotel located on a lovely 17-acre peninsula with easy access to UN World Heritage Site Old San Juan. The hotel has numerous amenities, including a spa, a bird sanctuary, water sports, and children's activities.


The conference will include an optional half-day visit to the Arecibo Observatory (left), the world's current largest single-dish

Award winners from the conference included Outstanding Teacher-of-the-Year, Dr. Maria Gershutz from Trine University; Campus Representative, Ashley Bernal, Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology; and Service Award, James Hansen, also from Rose-Hulman. The Best Paper, "Is It a MOOC? Or Is It a Textbook for the 21st Century?" was written by Mark M. Budnik and Stewart Thomas from Valparaiso University.

As we look forward into our next conference back in the section we are excited to be currently working out the details with Purdue University in West Lafayette in preparation for them to be our host site in 2018. It will be great to see the growth and advancement that has taken place at the campus since our last visit.

Remember there are annual award opportunities offered by the section that are recognized at the upcoming conference. In order to qualify, you must be a member of the ASEE and the Illinois-Indiana section, so get your renewals processed! This year the conference will recognize the Best Paper and Best Student Posters with awards. The Best Paper award, which includes a \$250 stipend for the winner, is selected from papers submitted to the conference as nominated by the reviewers and the program chair. The selection is based on both the written manuscript and the presentation. In addition, the section presents the following section awards annually: Outstanding Campus Representative, Outstanding Service, and Outstanding Teacher.

To apply for the Outstanding Teaching Award, which includes a \$750 stipend, you must follow the guidelines as presented on the national ASEE website <a href="https://www.asee.org/member-resources/awards/full-list-of-awards/section-awards">https://www.asee.org/member-resources/awards/full-list-of-awards/section-awards</a> and submit an electronic nomination packet me as the Section Chair. The Awards Committee will then review the nominations and select who it considers the most notable. The recipient agrees to present a keynote address on a topic of their choosing at the following year section conference. If you know of someone deserving of this honor, please nominate that individual prior to January 10<sup>th</sup>, 2017.
