Education Proposal	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Collaboration on a shared proposal on a specific topic.• Planning a regional educational effort

- a description of the workshop topic,
- workshop leader qualifications,
- the workshop agenda and general approach,
- the requested timeframe,
- any requirements for the workshop space,
- minimum and maximum number of attendees,
- workshop fee, if any
