3) PIC IV Update

Talking Points:

- Katilin Mallouk (mallouk@rowan.edu) will be replacing Beth Holloway. Professional Interest Council (PIC). Each PIC Chair is a liaison to the division to the boards to ASEE.
- There is currently a VP of Scholarship and Journal of Engineering Education (JEE) position open
- The scholarship publications committee will be primarily responsible for JEE and Advances in Engineering Education (AEE) journals
- The ASEE magazine PRISM will be moving to a more digital magazine with fewer printed publications (four a year)
- For new ASEE members, there will be a future announcement for a \$50 discount code
- An ethics committee has been established to explore harmful behaviors and as a result, they are asking divisions to include more language about what happens to an office when they cannot continue a term and to consider more inclusive language (e.g., webmaster versus webmanager)
- If any division has any opportunities for students, please let Katy Sayeh know for widespread advertisement
- BASS account fees will be dropped in Fiscal Year (FY) 2023. This is being covered by the increase in dues plus the transition to more electronic processing.
- Membership in ASEE are 9,447 members as of June 2022
- WIED membership went down from 961 to 849 members as of 6/13/2022
- WIED PIC paper is the Best Paper Award (Collateral Damage: Investigating the Impacts of COVID on STEM Professionals with Caregiving Responsibilities)

- Conference Best Paper Award (Dr. Joyce Main and Amanda Griffith for their paper titled, “The Impact of Math and Science Remedial Education on Engineering Major Choice, Degree Attainment, and Time to Degree.”)
- The number of people who attended ASEE this year are 3,310

 - There was concern that First-Year Programs should consider integrating with MIND and WIED into the socials
 - There was concern for the limited numbers of underrepresented minorities currently in WIED
 - There was concern that within ASEE conference venues, MIND and WIED do not have equitable spacing in the Exhibit Hall and therefore is not visible to all. This is believed to be due to the alphabetical order naming for MIND and WIED within the ASEE Divisions.

Actions Items:

- Consider advocating for more equity of Exhibit Hall space on next year's ASEE conference in Baltimore.
- Consider having the division send the WIED papers to deans and administrator across the country and inviting them to become more involved with WIED
 - More specifically, include the findings from the WIED Best Paper (Collateral Damage....) with some summaries of the talking points of the paper and the issue of remote work for staff
